PART ONE

In round one the teams will create their own questions and/or statements. The questions and/or statements must be longer than one word. Meaning it cannot just be a one word sentence. The teams will say their answer aloud. The teams will take turns saying their answers. Teams cannot repeat an answer given by another team.

Each team may create any question and/or statement it chooses. The following sentences are just examples of Dakhóta questions and/or statements. The team can follow these examples or create their own.

Round 1 example sentences:

Dakhóta wičhíyaŋna hemáčha ye. I am a Dakota girl.

Dakhóta hokšídaŋ hemáčha do. I am a Dakota boy.

Waníyetu akémašakpe. I am sixteen years old.

PART TWO

In round two the teams will be given a prompt from the study packet and the teams must create a question and/or statement. The question and/or statement must be longer than one word. Meaning it cannot just be a one word question and/or statement. The teams will say their answer aloud. The teams will take turns saying their answers. Remember teams cannot repeat an answer given by another team.

PART 4 - FINAL QUESTION

At the end of the final round teams will be given a prompt from final question part of the study guide. All the teams will be asked to make a question and/or statement. The teams will be asked how many points they want to bid on their final answer. They can only bid points from the number of points they earned during the final round. Whoever has the most points wins 1st place, the team with the second most wins second place and the team with the third most wins third. If there is a tie the teams will be asked to make another question and/or statement until the winner is determined.
